## **Letter from the President**

O'ahu RC&D is honored to serve one of Hawai'i's most humble populations – our farmers and ranchers who work tirelessly to produce food for Hawai'i residents and visitors alike. Although this population is a small percent of the State's total (just 7000 people, or 0.5% of the estimated 1.4 million people), the fruits of their labor annually contribute \$2.9 billion to Hawai'i's economy - making agriculture one of the State's top three industries. This small population also stewards 1.1 million acres, which equates to approximately 27% of the total land mass. Management decisions and actions taken by farmers and ranchers ripple throughout our environment, hugely impacting the quality of Hawai'i's land and water resources, the quantity of fresh fruits and vegetables, and the health of individuals and communities.

It is critical to support individuals engaged in the local food and sustainability movement at its very foundation. That is why O'ahu RC&D works one-on-one with farms to evaluate potential threats to natural resources and identify appropriate solutions that not only improve management of the soil and water, but also contribute to long-term productivity and profitability.

## ASSIST: PLANNING & MONITORING

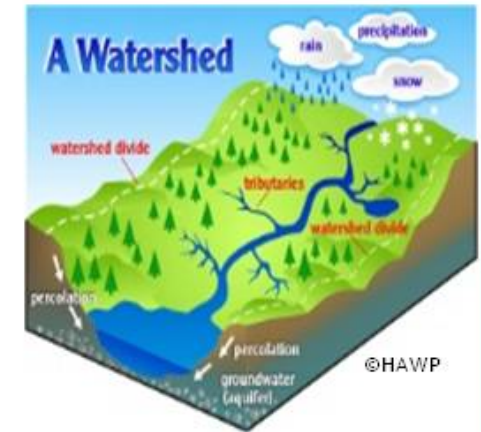
Developed **conservation plans** for thirteen farms improving stewardship on **2,750 acres**.



Provided third party audits of conservation practices on three farms (**3,562 acres**) and established agreements to begin audits for two additional sites.

## RESTORE: WATERSHED RESTORATION

Launched a project offering over **\$90,000** in cost-share grants to farms in Waiahole Watersheds.

Distributed **\$58,500** in cost-share grants to farms in the Waimanalo Watershed. Grants were awarded to nine farms, impacting **34 acres**.

Conservation practices installed prevented 155 tons of sediment from entering local waterways - approximately 15 large dump trucks full of soil!



## GROW: COVER CROPS



Sold over **10,000 lbs.** of 'Tropic Sun' Sunn Hemp seed...enough to cover over 250 acres!

ENGAGE: Engaged more than **2500** people through workshops and presentations on conservation planning and soil health. Workshops were conducted across O'ahu, and at various events like the Farm Fair and Hawaii Conservation Conference.

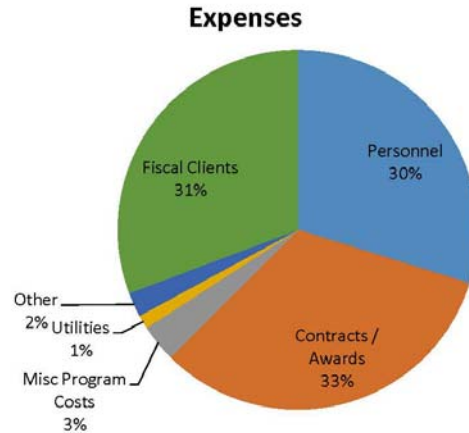
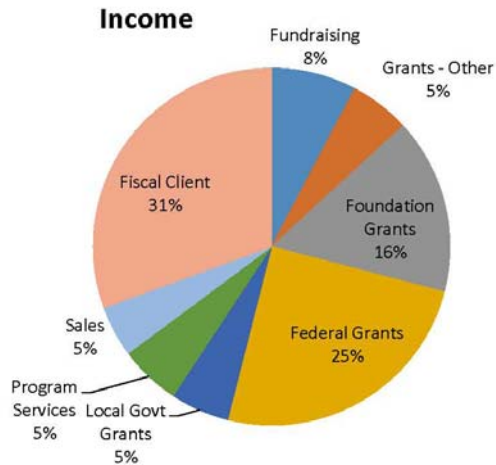


## 2015 Financial Recap

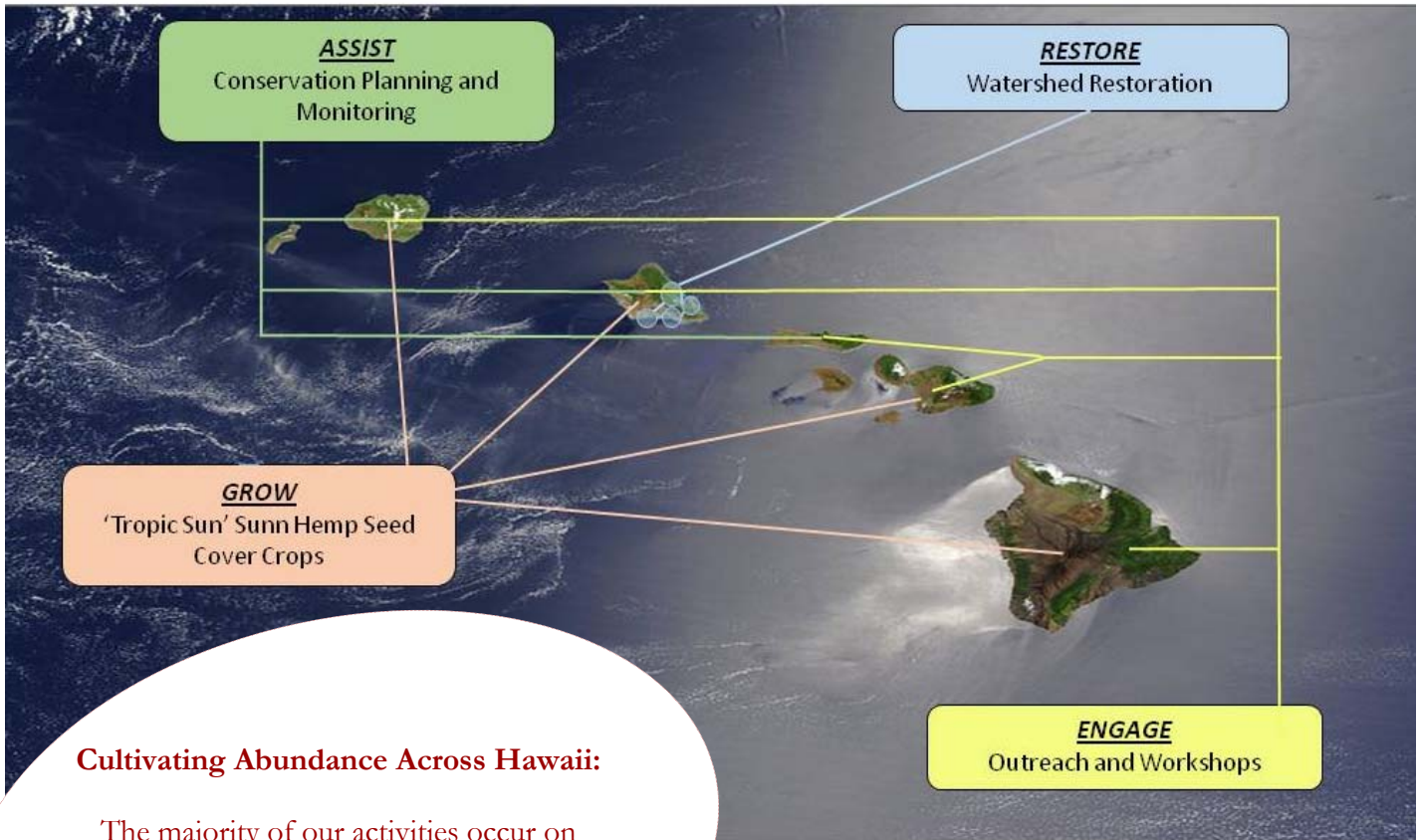
